In a European Area of Skills and Qualifications EU policies and tool should:

- be centred on the learner, promoting flexible learning pathways,
- support new phenomena such as the growing use of digital learning and internationalisation of education,
- provide better services to learners, workers and employers
- simpler, better understandable and more coherent, and
- support national structural reforms that aim to achieve these objectives.



Public consultation

- Public consultation ran from 17 December 2013 to 15 April 2014
- ✤ 289 replies + 85 position papers
- ✤ 44% replies from individuals
- Mainly from EU + EFTA, candidate and potential candidate countries + Australia

Issues under consultation





- 1. How to place a stronger focus on higher and more relevant skills
- 2. Further strengthening links between education/training, mobility and the labour market
- 3. Adapting to internationalisation trends
- 4. Ensuring overall coherence of tools and policies and further implementing the learning outcomes approach

Issues under consultation





- 5. Ensuring clarity of rules and procedures for the recognition of skills and qualifications for further learning
- 6. Increasing the focus on quality assurance
- 7. Providing learners and workers with a single access point to obtain information and services supporting a European area of skills and qualifications.

• 26 April – 5 May 2014



- Target group: 15+ (= 28,300)
- Approaching the issues under consultation in more accessible terms
- Results presented at Conference on 17 June 2014
